





Internship at Concerns

Four trainees from Karnataka State Council for Child Welfare did internship in Concerns Child Care centre for 15 days.

Case Study of school going child in Concerns Study Group Program

Nikitha, a student of Std III standard in Nirmala girl's school was from a poor and troubled family .Her mother Revathi was a domestic maid suffering from lucoderma . Nikitha s father was a drunkard and often involved in domestic violence ,to escape the situation mother and three children had moved to Janakiram layout . Nikitha was very silent in the class, always afraid of people, never opened her mouth even to say her name, no interaction with other students. After she joined Concerns study group she read louder, communicated with peers, expressed doubts to teacher, scored better marks in the school, also she is now a regular attendee at school. Her mother feels happy.

Case Study of community member affected with Tuberculosis treated through our DOTS

Xavier was a BTS driver with two children. Due to Tuberculosis he discontinued his work and was very weak and was at home. He could not travel every day to hospital to get treatment. His wife works as a maid. Through a community home visit, a Concerns community worker found him and transferred his treatment from Cox Town TB unit to CUF DOTs centre. Regular follow ups done. He completed six months treatment and was cured of Tuberculosis. Now he is in better health and working in a hospital as a driver.

Concerns Community College 2012-2013

Case Study of a community college student who did Office management course:

Bhaghyalakshmi: Bhagyalaksmi, community college student was a mother of two children from Jeevanahalli. Soon after completing her II PUC she choose to marry Narasimha against the will of her parents. Her husband works as an office boy in an office. Since she suffered from prolonged Jaundice, she could not continue her higher education. Through a Concerns community worker she heard about Concerns Community College. She joined the Office Management course and successfully completes her course in spite of her ill health, children's illness and family problems. She scored the highest marks. Concerns' Community College motivated her and made her join the B.Com in Mysore University. During the course, Concerns with the collaboration of Presidency College of Hotel Management organised a 20 weeks course. She was able to do that course and a seven week course in Cafe Coffee Day. She was able to manage both the courses, and seeing her efficiency, she was offered a job in Cafe Coffee Day.

Case Study of a community college student who did Early childhood care Course

Manjula a community college students was a mother of two young children and was 24 years old. She had studied upto 9th standard in kananda. Her husband, being is a barber running a beauty salon for men was earning less income. Manjula put her daughter in Concerns child care centre and got motivated to join Concerns Community College. She took the teacher training course. Initially she felt shy and found it difficult to cope with all the classes because classes were conducted in English but she didn't give up. She continued attending classes and with a lot of help from her friends in the class and teachers' guidance she worked hard to complete her course. Her placement for teaching practice in schools gave her confidence and encouraged her to look forward to work as teacher. At the end of the course, to her joy, she got a job as a part-time shadow teacher for remuneration of Rs.3500/- per month.




